White House Happenings - Update

- **Migratory Bird Rule** – During the Trump administration, an effective date was set for the final rule, "Regulations Governing Take of Migratory Birds." This rule provided a compliance structure regarding "incidental take." Let the term be defined as the unintentional unlawful, by any means, take capture, hunt or kill of any migratory bird. As the definition indicates, this rule is in direct support of the overarching Migratory Bird Treaty Act (MBTA). The Oil and Gas Industry advocated for the implantation of this final rule because migratory bird patterns and nesting can severely impact operations. The final rule intention was to provide clarity on the different interpretations of incidental take and how compliance may be

enforced. Historically these regulations have allowed for selective persecution of our industry by activist groups when other means have failed.

The Biden administration decided to delay the effective date of the rule. Citing the rule was in opposition to the Jan 20, White House memorandum on how Federal agencies consider postponement of rules already published in the Federal Registrar due to reviewing questions of fact, law, and policy they may raise. The Administrative Procedure Act (APA) requires any postponement of effective dates of rules must have a public notice and comment period, which the Biden administration did not provide or address. It could be interpreted that the Biden Administration justification for postponement is that the final rule is not consistent with the purpose of the MBTA, however an official rebuttal has not been published. If that is the stance the Biden Administration takes, case law will have to be provided proving the MBTA's historical purpose was to include birds not in migration. Ultimately resulting in a lengthy and arduous battle of case law interpretation leaving the industry open to potential incidental take violations and costly fines.

- **Order 3395** – The Department of Interior (DOI) stated they will not be renewing the 60 day order requiring administrative (appointed) political officials to approve the processing of Oil and Gas Operation permits on Federal lands. The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) has resumed the duty. This news will be closely monitored and anyone having any information related to it is encouraged to share with the group.

Colorado Climate Action Plan to Reduce Pollution –

The initial Stake holder/ Public Listening Sessions have concluded. Attached you will find several pieces of information for your review regarding this issue. While these initial listening sessions did not provide any direct action plan or finalized time frame, it's vital that we continue to monitor this situation closely. As everyone is aware, the zero bleed pneumatics rule will have a major impact on our industry. Please note that the Methane Reduction Task Force stated during the last listening session that the CDPHE specifically requested the Task Force create an action plan to eliminate all pneumatics that are not zero bleed. Any opportunity that the GCA has to provide comments that include financial impacts, etc. need to be ceased or at the very least evaluated.

The zero bleed pneumatics is just one issue being evaluated, it's very possible this Task Force will create many infeasible and financially grueling mandates on our industry and we need to make every effort to thwart this attack. Included below is the Draft Climate Equity Framework. I realize this is a

bit lengthy but please take a moment to read this as it is going to set the ground work for how our industry is impacted by new rules in the near future.
